For the Runner, From the Pastor - July 2022

Just prior to writing this article, I changed the paraments in the sanctuary. The paraments are the cloths that hang from the pulpit, rest on the communion table, and serve as our banners. There are four colors that we use: white for celebration (Easter! Epiphany!), purple or blue for reflection and confession (Advent and Lent), red for Pentecost (signifying the flame of the Holy Spirit), and green for "Ordinary Time". There are two chunks of ordinary time in our church year: a few weeks between the day of Epiphany and the beginning of Lent, and a much longer stretch between Pentecost and Advent.

The word "ordinary" comes from the Latin ordinalus, which means "showing order" (some of you math whizzes might think of "ordinal numbers"). It's sometimes easier to think about what it means to live a life of faith when we're in the midst of some special season like Advent/Christmas or Lent/Easter, but the church calendar reminds us that there is meaning each and every day. Whether it's the 14th Sunday of Ordinary Time (July 3, 2022) or the 33rd (November 13, 2022), there are opportunities for faithfulness and intentional living to be found.

Let me offer you some ideas about growing in your faith in these "ordinary days" of summer, when many of us find our schedules rearranged into something that is definitely out of the ordinary!


Get outside. Maybe you'll sit on the porch, or maybe you'll take a bike ride or go fishing, or work in the garden. But go outside. And while you're there, be intentional! Read Psalm 8 after an evening of star-gazing. For a transcendental moment, sit on your porch during a thunderstorm and read Psalm 29. As you watch your garden or your children or your grandchildren grow, think about the ways that you have changed in the last two or twenty years.

Buy (and use) some stamps. That's right, go to the Post Office (or order them online) and spend some time in thoughtful, intentional correspondence with someone. Maybe you need to send a note of encouragement, or an affirmation. Perhaps you need to seek or offer forgiveness. Maybe you just have a silly cartoon to pass along. Give someone you love the gift of "real" mail and give thanks to God for the way that Jesus reaches out to us.

Sit in a different pew. If you've been worshiping at home, come into the building. The airflow is good, the transmission rates are down, and summer travel generally means thinner crowds. If you're traveling, visit another congregation. Show up and see how God is moving in that place. If there's something that is preventing you from worshiping at CHUP, talk about it with me or one of the leaders of the congregation. Be intentional as you worship this summer.

Wonder! Take some time to read a good book, to wander down a new trail, or to learn something new. Maybe listen to a different kind of music for a week, or change your social media habits, or try a new discipline such as giving blood or picking up litter. Learn how to do something different! It's "ordinary time" – that is, time that is built for meaning! Time that is meant to count! I hope and pray that you are using the gift of time you've been given this season in ways that enrich yourself, honor God, and encourage your neighbor.

I'll look for you in worship!
