On May 23, the family of faith at Crafton Heights will join with the church around the world in celebrating the Day of Pentecost. We'll read from the second chapter of Acts and remember how it was that a group of believers, huddled together and perhaps isolated from others in their world due to fear and distrust, was given the gift of communication, language, and community in new and fresh ways. One of the miracles of Pentecost was the ability to express thoughts in new and previously unknown languages – resulting in the proclamation of Jesus' resurrection and the triumph of God's love.

During our fourteen-month experience with the Coronavirus, we, too, have discovered new ways to communicate. "Zoom" isn't just an expression used to convey speed, it's a verb we all know: "so, we'll zoom tonight at 8?" is a sentence that makes sense to us now in a way that it wouldn't have last February. Our world, much like that of the first disciples, abounds with new ways to communicate: in addition to Zoom, we can tweet or TikTok or Whatsapp; we can Instagram and Picuki and who knows what else...

But I've noticed a significant difference between our experience and that of the church in the first century. The group that had been huddled in the upper room had a message that was then shared with the world. They took



their cues from the Lord, and they spoke of what they had seen and what they knew. They were sure of the message, and then they relayed it.

Too often in the past year, American Christians have not followed that example. We've become outraged or indignant by some rumor or half-truth, and have then sought to amplify that notion by whatever means we found convenient. We have chosen to believe one particular flavor of the truth; we have chosen sides and maligned those with whom we disagree; we have fostered discord and distrust rather than seeking truth and wanting to be conformed to it.

The early church had been forced into hiding, and then burst out into the streets in a festival of truth-telling and love that showed itself in action (read the last few verses of Acts 2 and see how those Christians sought to bless their neighbors). As we continue this slow trajectory of re-emergence after the pandemic, let us similarly commit to proclaiming with boldness the truths that we know; let us move to mitigate the spread of disinformation and commit to not only speaking what we know, but to doing what we know to be right and loving. Let us embrace this as a Pentecost of gratitude and joy, and join our earlier siblings in the faith by living with "glad and generous hearts!"

I look forward to celebrating the eternal truth and love of Jesus with you in new ways this Pentecost and beyond!






Preschool
